

Questions, delays mount for First NBC Bank **Holding Co.**

HoldCo Asset Management, a New York investment adviser, has sent a public letter to Ashton Ryan Jr., president and CEO of First NBC Bank Holding Company, regarding concerns over purchased debt.

In the letter, HoldCo said that in April it bought \$8 million in face value of FNBC's publicly registered 5.75 percent subordinated debt.

"At the time of the purchase, we believed that our discounted purchase price reflected an overly bearish assessment of FNBC's prospects and that once you finalized the accounting restatement, the market would come to its senses," the letter

Louisiana flooding a reminder of disaster prep for small businesses

Floodwaters that have inundated south Louisiana are a reminder to small business owners of the need to prepare for possible disasters.

An estimated 75 percent of those affected by the weekend's catastrophic floods do not have flood insurance, according to a report by the Baton Rouge Business Report that cites Louisiana Commissioner of Insurance Jim Donelon. He estimates about 30 percent of business owners are insured against flood damage.

Donelon says that on average only about 25 percent of the state's property owners will be able to recoup their losses under the federally subsidized National Flood Insurance Program.

'I'm willing to bet about one-fourth of those affected will be insured and threefourths won't," he told the publication. "Unfortunately, there is nothing they can do about it at this point."

President Barack Obama has declared several affected parishes to be major disaster areas, which should make it easier for flood victims to receive disaster aid.

Gov. John Bel Edwards said FEMA will make available up to \$33,000 per household under the program. In many cases, however, that cash assistance goes to pay for rent, temporary housing and some home repairs, and doesn't begin to cover losses from flood damage. Flood victims

Name of app: 1Password

What is it? Creates and manages your passwords

Cost? Free, but \$9.99 to unlock advanced features

How do you get it? The app is available for iOS and Android. It works best if you also purchase a copy for your PC or Mac, available at 1 password.com.

Why use it? It is impossible to remember a large number of complex, unique passwords, but a password manager like 1Password creates and stores these passwords and automatically enters them for most sites accessed using your computer or mobile device. Thus, you have both convenience and better security. As a bonus, you can use the app to secure store other important, confidential information such as private notes, medical information, social security numbers, credit cards, etc. On the iPhone, there is an option to access all of your passwords using TouchID, so you can log in to a website with your username and password just by using your fingerprint.

Name of app: Fantastical

What is it? An alternative to the iOS built-in calendar app

Cost? \$4.99

How do you get it? The iOS App Store. More information at flexibits.com/fantastical-iphone.



Why use it?

The main screen of Fantastical makes it easy to see and scroll through all of your upcoming appointments. You can also create appointments quickly by using natural language; for example, you can talk to your iPhone (or type) and enter "Lunch with Tina at Commander's Palace on Friday,"

and the app will create a calendar event at noon on the next Friday with Commander's Palace in the location field, along with an arrow that you can tap to launch the maps app to get directions to the restaurant. The app uses the same underlying database as the built-in calendar app so you can go back and forth between the two apps.
